We would like to invite you to an international conference devoted to the protection of industrial heritage in connection with the strengthening of the environmental protection process.

For Upper Silesia, like many former industrial centers, this is a very important topic.

Using the experience of experts, we want to talk about the importance of preserving industrial heritage and its appropriate use for local communities.

An important topic among the speeches will be defining the most advisable ways of preserving industrial heritage while supporting the process of improving the natural environment. Presenting the results of research on reducing the carbon footprint in construction will be one of the topics of the meeting.

The choice of Katowice as the location of the Conference is not accidental. A number of large projects to preserve and reuse former industries are underway here. In recent years, several technical museums based on historic industrial facilities have been established.

In addition to presentations and discussions, we are planning a trip to former industrial facilities important for Upper Silesia. We will visit the historic Silesia zinc rolling mill in Świętochłowice, which has been shut down, and we will also see one of the still active coal mines, which may become a demonstration mine in the future for the extraction of coal for historic locomotives and steam vehicles.

We also want to talk about mining energy resources necessary to keep technical monuments in operation, such as steam locomotives and steam engines.

A separate topic will be a discussion with international journalists on their support for the process of industrial heritage protection.

We attach the conference program to the letter.

We really look forward to your participation in the Conference.



About the Conference

During the Conference, supporting actions for the protection of industrial heritage in Europe and their impact on the natural environment will be presented. Based on previously conducted research and completed projects, good practices for adapting technological monuments to new functions leading to the reduction of the carbon footprint will be discussed.

The continued need to use fossil fuels for the operation of industrial and mobile heritage will also be discussed.

The possibilities for reusing industrial heritage objects will be discussed, among others, on the example of works aimed at preserving the monuments of the Gdańsk Shipyard.

Reducing the carbon footprint through the protection and re-use of historic industrial facilities will be one of the main topics of exchange of experiences during the planned conference.

A separate discussion panel will discuss experiences related to cooperation with the media in the process of preserving industrial heritage.

Issues to be discussed and the goals of the Conference:

- presentation of knowledge on contemporary methods of protection and use of industrial heritage, including the interpretation of old technologies
- evaluation of research on achieving CO₂ reduction while continuing operational use of industrial heritage
- international promotion of the value of the industrial heritage of the Gdańsk Shipyard
- promoting the establishment of TICCIH Europe, an organisation supporting research and protection of industrial heritage in Europe
- using industrial heritage as a valuable social and economic benefit to local communities
