Six finalists vie for title of European Green Capital 2012 and 2013

The competition for the 2012 and 2013 European Green Capital Awards has entered its final stages, with 17 candidate cities now whittled down to a shortlist of six. The finalists are Barcelona and Vitoria-Gasteiz from Spain, Malmö from Sweden, the French city of Nantes, Nuremberg in Germany and Reykjavík, the capital of EU candidate country Iceland.

Over the coming months, the six finalists will be asked to submit further details to support their applications.

The announcement of the European Green Capitals for 2012 and 2013 will be made at a ceremony in Stockholm in late October 2010.
